Older homes gain efficiencies through the HES program



The Home Energy Solutions program helps older homes save energy dollars. The program is available to SCG's residential heating customers through the Connecticut Energy Efficiency Fund (CEEF) and the state's regulated natural gas and electricity companies for a low-cost \$75 fee payable directly to the authorized program contractor. The program is best for homes 25 years or older – properties that offer the greatest opportunity for energy savings. The program contractor will conduct a home energy assessment to identify both gas and electric savings opportunities and explain alternatives and provide applicable air sealing, duct sealing, water heating and lighting measures as well as information about applicable rebate programs, tax credits, financing options on eligible homes and other improvement opportunities. The 2010 Census is coming soon

The census is a count of everyone residing in all 50 U.S. states, the District of Columbia (Washington, D.C.) and U.S. territories, including Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, Guam, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands and American Samoa. It includes people of all ages, races, ethnic groups, both citizens and non-citizens. The U.S. Constitution requires a national census every 10 years.

Why is it important to participate? Because the results affect political representation and directs the allocation of billions of dollars in government funding toward states and communities, which guides local decision-makers in the development of important community planning initiatives, such as where to build new schools, roads and hospitals.

Between now and July, census workers will be making their rounds to verify addresses in their communities in preparation for the census.

Try planting some fuel savings this spring

Did you know that some well-placed landscaping can yield fuel savings. A strategic landscaping project not only makes the grounds around your home more ecologically attractive, but also serves as a natural way to reduce fuel consumption. As few as three trees placed properly around the home can lower both heating and cooling annually.

Trees that shed their leaves in the fall help reduce heating and cooling costs. When selectively planted around the home, they are nature's way of providing protection from the sun in summer and allowing in sunlight to warm your home in winter.

Vines also provide shading and cooling. Grown on trellises, vines can shade windows or even the entire side of the home.

Evergreen trees and shrubs planted on the north and west side of your home deflect winter winds. To deflect summer winds, plant them on the south and west sides of your home.
